AMAS-Academic Mobility for African Sustainable Development Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme

Background

The **Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme** supports higher education cooperation between countries in Africa. The scheme aims to promote sustainable development and ultimately contribute to poverty reduction by increasing the availability of trained and qualified high-level professional manpower in Africa. The programme's objective is to improve the skills and competencies of students and staff through enhanced mobility between African countries. Strengthening cooperation between Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Africa will increase access to quality education and will encourage and enable African students to undertake postgraduate studies in the African continent. Furthermore, **mobility of staff** (academic and administrative) will enhance the international cooperation capacity of HEIs in Africa. More precisely, the Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme aims to:

- ◆ Contribute to the improvement of the quality of higher education through the promotion of internationalisation and harmonisation of programmes and curricula within participating institutions.
- ◆ Enable students, academics and staff to benefit linguistically, culturally and professionally from the experience gained in the context of mobility to another African country.

Eligibility Criteria

1. The Call Targets 10 academic Staff, ideally 2 from and to each Partner University
2. Academic or administrative staff, hereafter referred to as "staff", must comply with the below criteria:
 - a. Work in or be associated with one of the Partner Universities; OR
 - b. Be a national and resident in any of the eligible countries covered by the Programme;
3. Eligible to apply for Staff exchange for a duration of THREE (3) months;
4. Ability to offer academic, research and/ or administrative service within the confines of the theme: Social Sciences and Governance, relevant to meet the learning outcomes of any of the listed 38 courses of academic mobility ([Doc T1-Table of Mobility Courses](#));
5. Ability to steer the AMAS Project Staff Mobility objectives and expectations;
6. Competence in language of course delivery at recipient Partner University.

Application Details & Procedure

1. Application letter justifying contribution to the objectives and expectations of Staff Mobility;
2. Updated curriculum vitae;
3. At least two (2) years of teaching experience and/or contribution to academic project work;
4. Indication of relevance to any course offered by the Recipient University at the time of mobility, that the visiting Staff can co-teach; At least one publication relevant to the theme of Social Sciences and Governance;
5. One recommendation from either the Chair of Department, Dean or head of Academic Division;
6. Evidence of quality work, by any means including staff and students evaluation;
7. Willingness to give at least one academic talk while at the Partner University;
8. Willingness to support academic activities including decision making, academic talk, and AMAS Project work, while at host university; A written and signed commitment of the academic staff to stay in the Partner University and meet the Project expectations.

Applications are called on Monday 11th June 2018 and will be closed on Wednesday 25th July 2018 at midnight (45 days)

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
